

Loving your neighbour


One day a Jewish teacher asked Jesus this question, "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus told him a story to show that a neighbour is anyone who needs help.


Have you ever been lost? If so, you will know how marvellous it is when someone finds you and takes you home.

One day Jesus talked about a farmer who sowed seeds by scattering them on the ground. Not all the seeds became plants. Jesus said there were four things that could happen to a seed.
