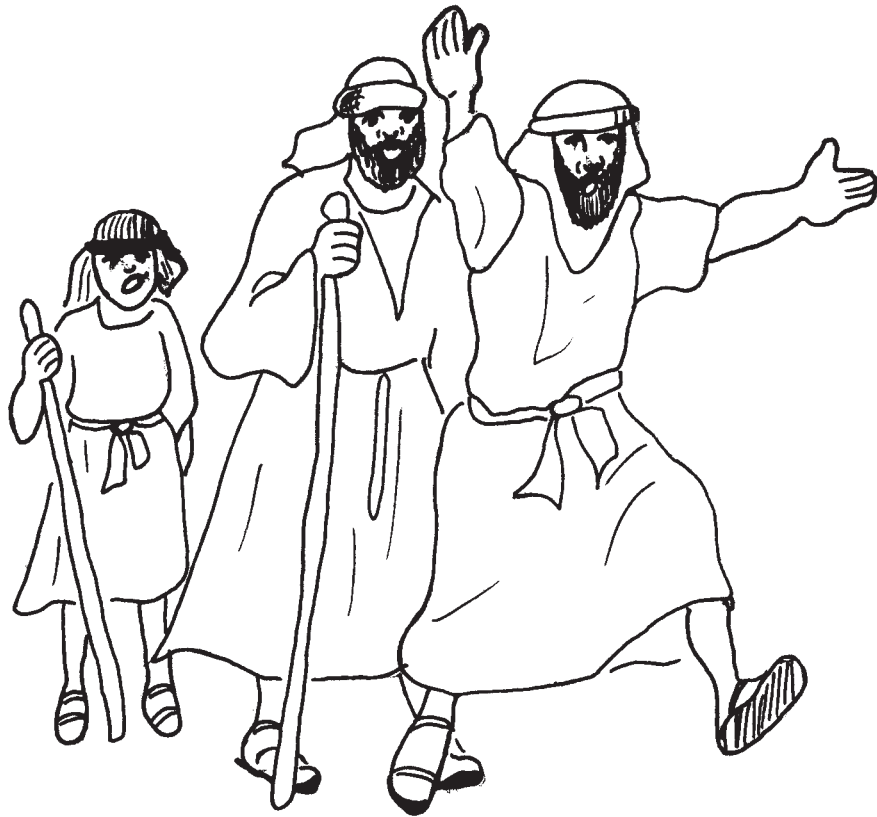
When the shepherds heard the good news about Jesus, they couldn't wait to go and see the Baby for themselves.
