


[Note: In this series of lessons you will be asked to look up many different verses *as well as* the Bible Reading. Read each question carefully before answering it.]

Who was Matthew?

The writer of the first Gospel was a Jew. His message was written for Jewish people to prove that the Lord Jesus was the great Person promised by God, through the prophets, to the Jewish people. They had been waiting for their Messiah (or Christ) for many years.



Take the first letter of each object to discover Matthew's other name.

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Now read **Luke 5: 28**. Write out what Matthew did when he obeyed Jesus.

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Today the Lord Jesus is saying the same to us, as He did to Matthew. Are we prepared to do the same as Matthew and commit our lives to Him? From that moment on, Matthew was a changed man and became one of the Lord's twelve disciples. As he travelled with the Lord Jesus, he heard a lot of His teachings and saw many of His miracles.

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This King had long been promised.

The writings of Moses and the prophets were very important to the Jews. Today, these are known as the Old Testament. They contain many promises about the coming King whom they called the Messiah. Over 100 times Matthew referred to verses from the Old Testament to prove that Jesus was this King.

Look up **Matthew 21: 4 & 5** and write out above what one of the Old Testament prophets had said 500 years earlier.

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The King rejected and crucified.

Although it was clear to some that Jesus was the long promised King, most of the Jews refused to accept Him, and later He was crucified.

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Now read **Matthew 27: 42** and write out what the religious leaders wanted Jesus to do before they would believe Him.

Lesson No. 2 The Gospel Writers - Mark

In contrast to Matthew, Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels and was written mainly with the Romans in mind. If you read it through you will notice that Mark doesn't mention many Jewish customs, as Matthew did. Mark's story is like a fast moving action picture!

Who was Mark?

Mark was his Latin (Roman) name, but among the Jews he was called by his Hebrew name.

Read **Acts 12: 12** again to discover what it was, then underline the correct answer.

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In this Bible Reading we also see that Mark's family was well known in the early days of the church. His home was used as a meeting place for Christians in Jerusalem.




1. What were the Christians doing?

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We read in a letter Peter wrote (1 Peter 5: 13) that he calls Mark "my son". This didn't mean Peter was his father but that Mark was someone very special to him. It may well have been because Mark had become a Christian through hearing about the Lord Jesus from Peter.

As a Christian, Mark wanted to serve God. We learn from reading Acts 12: 25 and 13: 4 & 5 how Mark helped his cousin Barnabas and Paul in spreading the Good News about the Lord Jesus.

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However, on Paul's second missionary journey, he wasn't happy about taking Mark with them.

Read **Acts 15: 36-38** and write IN YOUR OWN WORDS why this was.

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Write the name of the man who wanted Mark to go with them.

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Though Mark had failed in the early stages of his service for God, as he grew older he learned from his mistakes. In fact, at the end of Paul's life, he sent for Mark, because he knew Mark could help him. (See 2 Timothy 4: 11.)

Mark describes Jesus as the Perfect Servant.

It is wonderful to see that God could use a man, who had sometimes failed in His service, to write about God’s Perfect Servant, the Lord Jesus Christ.

In the 16 chapters of his Gospel, Mark concentrates on what the Lord Jesus **did**, more than on what He **said**. In fact, he records 18 miracles.

Because this is the story of a Servant, Mark leaves out details about the birth and early years of the Lord Jesus and moves right into His busy, public life.

A servant is one who is busy with his hands.

To continue God’s great work, the Lord Jesus chose some special servants.

Luke's name is mentioned only three times in the New Testament. He was a very close friend of Paul. As we read through 'The Acts' which he also wrote, we see that he is frequently with Paul. (See [Acts 16: 10-12.](#))




Who was John?


